This book is about our code of conduct.



Our code of conduct is a list of rules that people in the DREAM Network must follow.

The DREAM Network wants to make employment better for disabled young people.



The code of conduct is for

- employers
- and



disabled young people.

What we want you to do

Show **respect** to everyone.



Respect means we want you to

- listen to other people
- be kind to other people



• not hurt other people.

Show you care about what other people say.



You might

• use an emoji reaction



• ask questions.

It is okay if you do not agree with other people.



You must show people respect even if you do not agree with them.

We also want you to help us be **inclusive**.



Inclusive means everyone

feels important

• can be part of something.

For example, to help us be inclusive you can try not to interrupt other people.



Be patient.

Some people might

need more time to talk



need more time to type

use a communication device.



Think about what you want to say before you speak.



It is okay to ask questions.

It is okay to get things wrong.



Think about how you communicate.

You could think about

- if you talk very fast
- if you use lots of hard words.



We also want you to tell other people about the DREAM Network so more people can join.

What we do not want you to do

Do not say things that might make other people feel

sad



- scared
- they are not safe.

Do not make **threats** to other people.



Threats are when you say you will

- hurt another person
- damage things that belong to another person.





Do not say things that you know will make other people angry.

Do not treat other people differently because of who they are.




For example, do not treat other people differently because of their

- disability
- religion



• sexuality.

Sexuality means who you are attracted to.





- woman
- man
- both woman and man

not woman or man

something else.

Your gender can change at different times.

Do not

- make jokes about sex
- ask other people about sex.





Only people who **register** for the DREAM Network can come to the meetings.



Register means a person tells us they want to be part of the DREAM Network.



Do not tell people who are not part of the DREAM Network

• when DREAM meetings happen



 how they can come to a DREAM meeting.



We need people to register so we can keep everyone safe
